- Live in Tarrant County
- Disabled, elderly, grandparents raising grandchildren
- Low income/fixed income
- Does not have working central air conditioning or a working window air conditioner
- Provide a federal benefit award letter for eligibility (SSI, SSDI, SS Retirement, SS Survivors, TANF benefit, Veterans benefits)
- One (1) AC unit or AC/Heat unit per household

The course offers a comprehensive understanding of mental health conditions with topics ranging from stigma to relapse prevention to advocacy and much more.
