In 1999, the Wedgwood Baptist Church shooting happened as a result of a man suffering from an untreated mental illness. Former Fort Worth Mayor, Kenneth Barr, turned to local mental health providers, requesting a plan to improve access to quality mental health services for all Tarrant County residents. With this, Mental Health Connection of Tarrant County was established, and this core group has expanded to over 100 members.
